

# **EPIPHANY**

The word epiphany is often used when a person realizes his faith, or when (s)he recognized God at work in life and the world. "The Epiphany" refers to a realiza-



tion that Christ is the Son of God. We celebrate the visit of the three wise men as the revelation of the incarnation of the infant Christ. The date of Epiphany is January 6th or the twelfth day of Christmas. Epiphany Sunday is celebrated either the 1st or 2nd Sunday of January.

This year Epiphany, January 6th, falls on the first Wednesday evening of our 2016 Sardis Academy session. We will celebrate the feast of epiphany together and learn more about this special day on the liturgical calendar. Dinner will be served at 5:45, and a celebration will follow at 6:30. 
