## **IN THIS MONTH OF AMERICAN CELEBRATION OF FREEDOM AND INDEPENDENCE, MAY WE PAUSE TO REMEMBER...**

Through the years as our country was established and expanded, we did not practice inclusion or respect of our native peoples! Explorers, settlers, armies, and governmental powers systematically removed native dwellers from their lands into captivity or onto unfamiliar land not of their choosing. Their freedom denied. Their voices silenced. Many of their lives were lost as a result of violence, disease, hunger and exposure.

Please ponder the concept that much history was written by "winners" at the expense of those who lost so much. As North Carolinians, we remember the tragedy of our Cherokee people on the Trail of Tears.

Throughout the month of July, our worship display is intended to celebrate the strength and spirituality of native Americans. Enjoy the beauty and unique art created from nature featured in the tepees of plains peoples. The photo backdrop was taken of the Blackfoot nation in the late 1800's. It was colorized according to journal entries of the time.

Our display for July was inspired by Susan Phillips and Janette Grassi. Janette created the tepees; William and Marge (from Jerry's collection) added other native visuals.
