SARDIS ORDINATIONS

On Sunday, April 22nd, Sardis Baptist Church held a service of ordination for its newlyappointed deacons and ministers. The congregation commissioned Kate and Jose Mata as deacons, Hilary Kearns as Minister of Music, and Kathryn Kreutzer as Minister of Congregational Support.

During the service, every member of the congregation was invited to lay hands of blessing on each new candidate (an ancient ritual of setting apart God's people for Christian service), and sign the certificates of ordination (at Sardis, leaders are called by the entire congregation). Bob Stillerman and Jonathan Eidson offered ordination challenges to each new candidate. The Board of Deacons offered words of affirmation to the newly-ordained ministers; Kathryn and Hilary offered words of affirmation to the Board of Deacons; and Melissa Bowlin (past Chair of Deacons) offered words of affirmation to the collective Sardis Boards. June Ross quilted personalized stoles for Hilary and Kathryn, which were presented to them by Tim Moore. Outgoing board members, as well as the newly-ordained deacons and ministers were also given one of Sardis' most prestigious honors: induction into the Order of the Blessed Chocolate Praying Hands!

After worship, the congregation enjoyed a potluck lunch in the picnic shelter. The food was delicious, but the company was even better! Church members enjoyed the chance to visit with extended family and friends who had come for the celebration.

April 22nd was also Earth Day. In addition to renewing its leadership, Sardis focused on renewing its campus. Church members spent time planting Easter lilies along the edge of the labyrinth, clearing debris and overgrowth, and spreading pine needles. It was a fitting end to a full and happy day. 
One of the things that I love about Sardis Baptist Church is that we are involved in lots of things. Since the start of the 2017/2018 school year, we've had direct involvement with 18 organizations in Charlotte – we've hosted representatives to learn more about their initiatives, or partnered with them through missional projects and offerings. Here are two you might not be aware of:

United Baptist Association – We're part of a consortium of Churches in Charlotte called the United Baptist Association that helps to fund Hope Chapel. Hope Chapel is located adjacent to the Charlotte Men's Shelter (currently under renovation), and every Sunday at 8 a.m. hosts a lively worship service for neighbors connected to the shelter. Neighbors enjoy a few hymns, a short sermon, a hot cup of coffee, and access to basic supplies like toiletries and socks. Proceeds from Sardis' annual ministry plan help fund operating needs of the chapel (utilities and repairs), and during the month of December, Sardis collected warmth items for chapel guests. And two Sundays a year, I'll be the chapel proclaimer.

Medicine for the Heart – For the second year in a row, Sardis participated in the Baptist Retirement Homes' Medicine for the Heart offering. During the month of April, we collected spare change in medicine bottles (and few checks, too!). This year, we raised \$317.43. The proceeds will be used to help purchase prescriptions for low income older adults across our state.

You may not realize it, but your generosity, rather in the form of annual giving, or in the form of loose change, helps make a difference in our world. And when we do a lot of little things consistently, we make a big impact. Keep up the good work!


There are nine Sundays between June and July, so look for more updates about which talented musicians will be joining us each week!

RECENT MISSIONS

Sardis Baptist has numerous ministry partners that are supported through our annual budget and ministry plan. But it's a rare day on our calendar that we aren't also holding a drive in support of some grassroots partner and friend that we've met along the way (i.e. school supply drives, food drives, coin drives, CROP Walk, cookie sales, toothbrush collection, warmth gifts, homeless holiday gifts, Uganda girls collection, etc.). In the past couple of months, we've successfully raised funds for two such organizations.

Although Baptist Retirement Homes is included in our ministry plan, their specific efforts to raise money for medications of elderly friends in need is not




friends in need is not **OF NORTH CAROLINA. INCORPORATED** included. Sardis participated in a recent coin drive to help. We set a goal to raise \$300 in copper and silver — and we exceeded it. Congratulations Sardis! Our grand total was \$317.43. Next year, we plan to increase our goal to \$325, so please start pinching those extra pennies now!

In the past couple of years we've formed a connection with Sherika Kemp, the PTA President of University Park Creative Arts school. This is a CMS magnet program



with Title I designation, (i.e. at least 75% of its students are designated as economically disadvantaged, which statistically speaking, increases the risk that students will fall behind). Sardis has undertaken efforts to support the UPCA PTA in various ways. Most recently, the school held a community resource fair called "Build Bridges Not Walls" where families had opportunities to network with one another as well as find information on resources like summer camps, credit unions, low-cost tech providers and healthcare. Sardis sent food and funds to help with this event. Thank you for your generosity!

SARDIS ORDINATIONS - STATEMENT OF PURPOSE

Four women have been ordained to gospel ministry by our congregation, and this past spring we established the position of Pastor Emerita. Another former pastor holds the title of Writer in Residence. We've also been open to bi-vocational ministry – both of our current pastors have employment beyond Sardis. Lay leadership is also essential. Deacons, elected from within the church body, are ordained and commissioned to offer congregational care. Board members and stewards, also elected or appointed from within, help accomplish more specific tasks. Together, ordained lay leaders and ordained clergy help fulfill the work of the church.

This morning, we have the high privilege of ordaining four remarkable people, each of whom has been called out – that is set apart for ministry – to share their gifts, and to help lead this congregation.

Much like the practice of baptism or marriage, we are acknowledging, in a very formal way, something that already is. When we baptize new believers, we are celebrating the connection and calling they've established with God; when we marry two partners, we are celebrating a love that already is; and when we ordain members of God's church, we are acknowledging what already is: God working, in a very purpose-filled way, through God's children.

Our tradition offers three types of ordination. There is ordination into gospel ministry. This type is usually reserved for persons seeking formal theological training, and seeking to serve in a pastoral role.

There is also ordination into lay ministry: we call these leaders deacons. These are the ones appointed to care for our congregation, just as the earliest deacons had the primary task of caring for their community. This morning, we will ordain Kate and Jose Mata as deacons of Sardis Baptist Church. They have loved us. And they have led us with their own special gifts. And this morning, we'll simply acknowledge that God has called them to that role in a formal way.

And finally, we have particular ordination – that is, we ordain persons with a very specific or particular calling. This morning, we are ordaining Hilary Kearns as our Minister of Music and Kathryn Kreutzer as our Minister of Congregational Support.

Hilary and Kathryn serve our congregation in a professional capacity. Hilary offers us her gift of music, as well as her gift of being invested in the lives of our congregants. Kathryn offers us her gifts of organization, creativity, and communication, and has served as a deacon. Each of them are integral in the planning of corporate worship, as well as the day-to-day operations of Sardis. More than anything, Hilary and Kathryn are persons who care about, who love, and who attend to the needs of Sardis and its people. Hilary Kearns and Kathryn Kreutzer are ministers. And this morning, we're simply acknowledging what already is.

Friends, God is calling each of us in new and exciting ways. May this time of installation and ordination be one where we continue to listen and respond to God's call for our lives, both individually and collectively.
