As the new school year begins, you'll notice a different look to some of our regularly-scheduled programs. Our goal is to offer multiple opportunities (and spaces) for both worship and fellowship.

Adult Bible Study, Tuesdays 1pm – The Adult Bible Study will resume on Tuesday, September 6th. We'll explore the Joseph novella, and later, parts of Exodus. All are welcome to attend. Participants can join at any stage. No preparation is necessary, only curiosity! (Note: We do realize that events during workday hours are not always accessible for everyone. If there are people interested in creating a weeknight Bible Study or discussion group, please alert Bob Stillerman, and we'll work to help get it facilitated).

Sardis Academy, Wednesdays – We'll have the same number of sessions this fall (eight), only they'll be spread out across the calendar. In September, we'll enjoy three sessions (9/7, 9/14, 9/21) with an emphasis on Hunger. On 10/12, in anticipation of the upcoming election, Elizabeth Mosely will lead us in a discussion about the Electoral College. In November (11/9 & 11/16), we'll explore the concept of Thanksgiving. We'll also attend Meck Min's Annual Interfaith Thanksgiving Service on 11/22. In December (12/14), we'll go caroling to homebound church members. The entire fall will be a balance of theological and missional exploration. For each session, dinner will be served at 5:45pm, and a program will follow from 6:30-7:30. Please plan to join us!

Special Worship Events – On a monthly basis (in most cases a Sunday afternoon or evening), Sardis will host events that offer a chance for both worshipful reflection and good-old-fashioned fellowship. We'll seek to use our whole campus to do so. In September (9/18), we'll host Sardis' inaugural animal blessing. In October, we'll walk in the CROP Walk (10/16), and we'll host a fall-themed picnic (10/23). In November (11/13), we'll host an evening Taize service, and in December (12/4), we'll host an Advent-themed Labyrinth walk.

Second Harvest Food Bank of Metrolina supplies food and essential grocery items to over 650 agencies feeding hungry people in 19 counties in our region. In Fiscal Year 2013-2014, they distributed over 45 million pounds to these organizations and to other food banks.

William Kruger has challenged Sardis Baptist Church to help him spend some money, (hopefully a lot of money)! He's asked us to collect shelf-stable food and other essential items for a food drive, and he will match our donations pound for pound. The donations will be given to Second Harvest Food Bank of Metrolina.

Collections are already coming in and will be accepted until November 6th. Items most needed are canned meats like chicken, turkey, ham and beef stew; canned fish like tuna, salmon and mackerel; and nut butters. Other shelf-stable foods are also requested, such as rice, pasta and cereal. Toiletry items and household supplies such as shampoo, soap, deodorant, paper products and cleaning supplies are also needed.
