Sardis Baptist Church will host a Blessing of the Animals on Saturday, September 29th at 10:00 AM. The service is an opportunity to recognize and give thanks for all of God's creation, especially our animal friends. Pets have a special place in our lives because they model unconditional love and affection. For many people, they provide companionship that is unavailable elsewhere. The service will offer a chance for each family's pet to receive an individual blessing, as well as a time of remembrance for departed pets. Children are encouraged to bring their favorite stuffed animals—teddy bears and stuffed flamingos need blessings too!

The Animal Blessing will take place next to the Sardis Picnic Pavilion on 5811 Sardis Road. Please do not bring food for your pets! THE SARDIS EXPERIMENT

A new school year is upon us. Hooray! And as I enter 36th grade, I'm excited about the new subjects with which we'll engage, and the new circles we'll create at Sardis.



We'll learn a few new things, and sharpen our command of things we've practiced over and over, and if we're lucky, we'll experience God (and one another!) in fresh, challenging, and transformative ways.

So what's on the syllabus? So many things to mention, but here are some highlights:

Sunday Worship: We generally follow the Revised Common Lectionary, a system of readings that covers vast portions of the Bible in a three-year cycle. And to do so in conjunction with Christians around the world. Some of our texts will comfort us. Others will provoke us. Still others will confound us, or inspire us, maybe even offend us. Nonetheless, we'll engage these texts, seeking to find a mix of both modern and ancient wisdom, and discerning collectively (that means lay and clergy alike!) God's call on this place called Sardis. And there will be times to mark the rhythms of the season, and the feelings that accompany these rhythms: Ordinal Time (the growth and renewal of Christ's earthly ministry); World Communion Sunday (the connectedness of a global table); All Saints Sunday (the fullness we've found in the Saints who have shaped us, and the grief we feel in their absence); Advent (the expectant hope of Christ's entry into the world).

Theology, Sardis Style: Tillie and Tim are at it again! Tillie is leading our Sunday School class in a discussion of John Shelby Spong's book *Reclaiming the Bible for a Non-Religious World.* And Tim, will lead an October series featuring lessons from his new book *Practicing Midrash: Reading the Bible's Arguments as Invitation to Conversation.*

God in the Not-So Ordinary: Join us for special events: an animal blessing; a pumpkin carving and glow; Sardis Academy sessions exploring the concept of boundaries; CROP Walk; spontaneous gatherings; and a 30th Anniversary Celebration, just to name a few.

There's something here for you at Sardis, just like there was something for you in each new school grade. The subjects, the people, the experiences, the music, they may all be slightly different. But the spirit will be the same. And your presence will help make Sardis more full in every way. (Continued at the bottom of the next page.)


SARDIS ACADEMY

SARDIS CROP CHALLENGE

Sardis doesn't just want walkers and donations! We want our community to immerse itself in issues related to hunger. So we're inviting you to participate in the 2018 Sardis CROP Challenge. Here's how it works: Everyone at Sardis (and friends, too!) are invited to see if they can earn 100 challenge points. Points can be earned in the following ways: • 25 points - Walk in CROP Walk (<u>CropHungerWalk.org/CharlotteNC/</u>

SardisBaptist) • Receive I point for every dollar donated up to \$25 • Receive 25 points for every hour of volunteer work donated to CROP ministry partners - Crisis Assistance Ministries, Loaves and Fishes, or Second Harvest Food Bank • 15 Points - Register a friend to walk in CROP Walk • 15 points for every article read about issues related to hunger (recommendations) • 10 points for every prayer given to empower our community to help eliminate hunger • 10 points for every scripture passage you read related to issues of hunger (recommendations) • 5 points for every act of encouragement you offer to a walk participant (word of thanks, note, text, etc.) • 5 points for every social media engagement (post, share, like, comment, picture, etc.) to encourage participation in this year's Challenge • 5 points per canned good donated to the Sardis Baptist Food Drive.

Scorecards are available in the church vestibule for you to track your points (or print your own). Points will be allocated on the honor system. Sardis will maintain a spreadsheet to keep tabs on the church's progress. Please report your points to the church office on a weekly basis. In the Meetinghouse, we will display a bulletin board listing each participant (and a gold star for every point), as well as a progress thermometer. Our goal as a community is to earn 5,000 points. (That's the equivalent of 50 people earning 100 points). To help get us started, Bob, Jacqueline, and Mary Allen Stillerman have pledged to give \$1 for every 25 points earned up to our goal of 5,000 points. Let's start walking today, so we can stop hunger in its tracks!
