Wednesday April 3, 2019 Nikola Taylor, Migrant Assistance Ministry

Join us as we learn about grassroots efforts to help provide food, clothing, and other necessities for neighbors making the journey from detention centers in Texas to other east coast cities. Fellowship meal at 5:45 PM followed by program at 6:30 PM.

Saturday, April 6, 2019 Sardis Cleanup Day

Join the crew anytime after 9:00 AM. Projects include brush clearing, spreading pine straw and mulch, cleaning windows, and more.

Welcome Home Kit

Sardis community members are encouraged to bring donations to help create a "welcome home kit" for a family working to transition from homelessness to permanent housing.

A New Kind of Easter Lily:

For many years, we have invited families to purchase Easter lilies in remembrance or honor of individuals. This year, in lieu of lilies, we are inviting families to make a donation of \$15 to the Migrant Assistance Fund. Sardis will assemble goody bags to be delivered to these neighbors, and will display them in the meetinghouse. And don't worry, we'll still have a few lilies on display in keeping with our tradition.

Good Friday, April 19th @ Noon


Join us as Sardis Baptist Church hosts a shared service with neighbor churches, Sardis Presbyterian and St. Stephen UMC.

A few Sundays ago, Mary Allen and I decided to plant some vegetable seeds – nothing elaborate, just some cucumbers, and beans, and something called rainbowcolored carrots. We collected rocks, and got a bag of potting soil, and rounded up old water bottles and Cool Whip containers. We poked holes in the containers, filled the bottoms with rocks, and then dumped just as much soil on each other and on the ground as we did in the containers. We carefully deposited our seeds, and we watered them well. And now we are waiting.

This week, a bean sprout is popping up. We feel SO accomplished! And each day that little plant grows, we get more and more excited. We're watching new life spring up out of old things.

It's so fitting that the season of Easter corresponds with the beginning of Spring. We watch a world full of brown become green, and we see the Earth remaking itself into something so consistent and so familiar, and yet SO surprising and SO new all at the same time. I don't know about you, but I can't tell you how many times I've been stopped in my tracks just admiring the trees, or plants, or flowers on the Sardis campus. I know they're coming, and yet still the daffodils in February, or the orange oak leaves in October, or the Easter lilies revived once more in May absolutely amaze me. I hope that never changes!

It's harder for us to see, because us humans don't have bodies that grow green leaves or pretty flowers, but God is doing new things in us, too! This community is a garden. We're working to create a soil full of nutrients that will shape, strengthen, and mold us into God's people. (Actually, I should say, the people God wants us to be, because we're already and always will be God's people!). I think the Easter season encourages us to both contribute to and take from the soil of this garden.

In the process, I think we become emboldened, empowered, and surprised all over again by the gifts that are born out of such a garden. Love, generosity, creativity, hugs, laughs, smiles, good meals, acts of kindness, thoughtful words, new relationships – these things are consistent at Sardis, and yet their consistent appearance each season brings newness, joy, and surprise into our lives.

So... Mary Allen and I will watch our beans sprout. But we will also watch for new things in our church buddies. And when we see them we'll be SO excited.

Sardís People... MELISSA BOWLIN

Recently we sang "Happy Birthday" to Melissa Bowlin. She celebrated her 60th birthday, and it was a joyous occasion that she could be physically present with the worshipping community at Sardis. For Melissa has spent the last year recuperating from an automobile accident that has left



her permanently disabled. On January 25, 2018 she was hit head-on by another vehicle, suffering multiple bone fractures. She was hospitalized for a month and then spent five more months in a rehabilitation facility. Set-backs have sent her back to the hospital for short stays, and a physical therapist comes to her house to help her with mobility issues.

Melissa has joined Sardis worship through the powers of this electronic age and has participated as a worship leader. However, the physical ability to attend church services has been the most significant lack she has felt. "The last year has been so exciting with the new members and attendees. So many new people that I haven't had a chance to build a relationship with. And all the new babies born into the church family! At least four, I think, and another to be among us soon."

Another way she feels incomplete is her inability to drive. Not being able to get into her car and drive to church or the store or anywhere. She has to depend on someone else to drive her to the meetinghouse or to accomplish life's daily chores like grocery shopping. "I don't have a lot of control over my life. And so much of my time is spent with various kinds of doctors!" she explains.

The year has brought blessings as well. Melissa acquired a son-in-law with the marriage of her daughter Sarah to Dan Criss; the marriage also brought her a grandson, Tyler. She became a great-aunt with the birth of a nephew's son. (Soon another nephew will make her a great-aunt for second time over!) "And I have met so many wonderful people from the hospital and from Royal Park rehab facility. I have found new friends during the recuperation process."




The weekend included plenty of time for relaxation and play and Sunday morning, Anne and I led worship for the group during which couples served each other Communion.
