



I LIFT UP MINE EYES... Rev. Bob Stillerman

Now that the Easter candy is on clearance, and the pollen count is up, and the weather is warmer, I see renewal happening every day.

Every lawn on the cul-de-sac has been treated (well all but one!), and those hedges and edges are angled perfectly. And you can't go too far without seeing a bucket, and a hose, and some Turtle Wax, and a big truck or a sporty coupe being made pretty again. Or after having its longawaited wash, being backed meticulously into a parking space one-hundred feet away from any sign of life in the grocery store parking lot – nothing spoils Resurrection quicker than door dings and bird poop.

There are new pastel wardrobes, and tanned bodies from tropical spring breaks, and organized garages, and new resolutions for healthier eating and living. The list goes on.

And don't get me wrong. I participate in plenty of these kinds of renewals. But if we're not careful, we can easily ignore the most important type of renewal this season. Too often, we view Easter as the culmination of our spiritual year rather than as a catalyst for ongoing renewal.

Easter morning doesn't end with a period. I think it's more of an ellipsis. And the question that remains for us is: "What are we going to do to resurrect, or reclaim, or renew God's spirit in our lives?"

In the past month alone, I can tell you for certain that I've given at least twenty hours of my time for errands like repairing my car, cleaning my house, taking out the trash, mowing my lawn, managing my finances, doing laundry, and on and on. Not to mention the ten intentional hours I'll give toward Game of Thrones, and at least a dozen more to the Braves in the coming month.

But I wonder, what would happen if I gave even a fraction of that "renewal" time to noticing where God is in my world? And even more so, seeking to notice the people and places for whom God's presence is not so apparent and noticeable?

Last Sunday, the stone was rolled away. And guess what, that'll still be true next Sunday and the next. And if we open ourselves to such a truth, we also open ourselves to an ongoing sense of renewal. No matter who takes the Iron Throne in a few weeks!





Children like to stay busy. For parents who want to limit screen time for their little ones, community opportunities for play and learning becomes an important resource. Having a family which includes three little girls sent Joey and Maria Byrd looking for children's activities in their area. Finding nothing close to their Mountain Island Lake home, the Byrds purchased a Romp N Roll franchise. Then the timeconsuming work began: securing a location, installing equipment, training staff.

The Mountain Island Romp N Roll opened in December, the third franchise in North Carolina. Classes are offered every day of the week and there are also times and areas for open playtime. Art, music and physical activity provide children with the opportunity to develop imagination, motor skills, socialization. Children aged three months to five years can attend one week and be a princess or knight; another week is pirate-themed; super heroes is yet another motif. So playlearning is always new and exciting. Families with preschoolers can attend functions like summer camp or a mother's day party, or can arrange for birthday parties. So many exciting activities beckon, one might wish to be a child again.

Both Maria and Joey still work at Wells Fargo. But their schedules are less hectic now that the Romp N Roll is estab-

lished. These days they most often go as customers! Well, actually, Isabella, Amaya and Leilana are the customers.

The most recent exciting event for the Byrds was the child dedication service for Leilana. The April 28 Sardis worship included a time for Joey and Maria to pledge their goal to provide a loving home for their daughter, undergirded by their faith.

We dedicate our children to God more as an agreement or covenant between the faith community and the child's family to teach the child about following Jesus. 




