## I LIFT UP MINE EYES... Rev. Bob Stillerman

A few weeks ago, Mary Allen's daycare class painted seashells. She's really proud of hers. It's blue (her favorite color!), and if you put your ear next to it, you can hear the ocean. She laughs, and she instantly remembers her annual trip to the beach. "There's sand, Daddy, and waves, and clouds, and the water's cold! And I can hear it. Do you wanna hear it, too?"

That got me thinking. Wouldn't it be nice if there was a seashell we could put up against our ear, and no matter how far away, nor what time of day, we could instantly hear Sardis Baptist Church: its laughter, its singing, its joy, its words of welcome?

Well, we sort of can. We do stream our services on Facebook Live, so you can always connect virtually on Sunday mornings in real time or find old archives anytime. And all those good sounds are housed in one box – just put your ear up to it, and yours eyes, too!

Okay, it's not quite the same thing as a seashell. But maybe that makes for a good summer challenge. What things, tangible and intangible, can we give to one another, to keep us connected this summer?

Can a handwritten note invite you to the water's edge, even if you live four hours away?

Is there power in a text, or a phone call, or even (gasp!) an inperson visit to friends new and old?

Can the memory of a kind word, or a prayer remembrance, or even some silly Sardis trinket sitting on your desk (Cheetos, Chocolate hands and crosses, and egg-shakers come to mind) recreate the divine community in a fleeting moment?

I think they can. And I think we, as a worshipping community of believers called Sardis, are really in the seashell business. We're creating life-giving memories, symbols and moments that seek to remind us of God's presence, and our connectedness in such a presence. And when we do that, the life, energy, and depth of worship that's created inside our walls, spills outside. In other words, God's goodness becomes mobile, transportable, and easily connected to.

So when you are at the beach this year, listen to a seashell. Sure, you'll hear the ocean. But if you listen closely, and if we're doing Church right, you'll hear Sardis, too.



## Sardis People ~ Allie Eidson

Allie wrote 30 hours of curriculum that focuses on interview prep, time management, and strategic planning.

In her free time, Allie enjoys cooking. She loves cookbooks and watches The Great British Bake Off almost every day. Her family is sometimes treated to delicious dishes in which she has "tinkered" with the original recipes to make the outcome her very own creation. Her mother cannot believe that she refuses to follow a recipe verbatim. This summer Allie is staying busy with StepUp Durham, where she has transitioned into a new role coordinating personal, professional, and financial workshops for graduates of the program and their families.

We worshipped Jesus instead of following him on his same path.


We made Jesus into a mere religion instead of a journey toward union with God and everything else.

## **MCS - Multiple Chemical Sensitivity**

Friends at Sardis Baptist serve as ministers to one another in many of the same ways our paid staff members do — and many other ways as well! Something we can all do to serve one another is to be aware of special needs of friends in our congregation. Some such needs are met without a second thought. When someone in a wheelchair needs help with a door there are multiple Sardisians at the ready, or when a family needs support during an illness our members prepare delicious homemade meals to deliver. Other special needs may not be as obvious and remain unknown unless shared with you. In that regard, we have a special need to share with you.

Have you ever heard of MCS (multiple chemical sensitivity)? MCS is a medical condition causing a physical reaction to various irritants that are common to daily use. Irritants vary between people afflicted with the condition and can include foods, cosmetics, exhaust fumes, cleaning supplies, and much more. Symptoms occur after breathing, touching or eating an irritant



and can range from mild to severe. Common symptoms include headache, dizziness, brain fog, nausea, fatigue, muscle and join pain. A minimal amount of chemical exposure may cause a reaction to an MCS patient – often so minimal that the irritant may not even be detectable by someone without MCS.

Sardis has numerous members who suffer with varying degrees of MCS, and we are making efforts to make our meetinghouse MCS friendly. We use natural cleaning products as well as natural hand and dish soaps. You can help too! If possible, please avoid wearing scented bath and body products or cosmetics when coming to Sardis. Also consider using unscented laundry detergents and fabric softeners. Synthetic fragrances are primarily made from petrochemicals, one of the biggest offenders to our MCS patients.

The field of science regarding MCS is growing, despite the well-funded lobbyists supporting the chemical industry. For more information please visit the website of **The Chemical Sensitivity Foundation** (chemicalsensitivityfoundation.org).
