2020 Advent Calendar

During the season of Advent, Sardis will be creating a Jesse Tree, which features a collection of ornaments representing the saints of our faith. This year's Advent calendar will feature stories of some of our faith sheroes and heroes. In addition, the calendar images feature trees from the Sardis campus. Each day includes a shero/hero to discover, as well as references to their corresponding scripture passage. We hope you'll take time to get to know these faithful women and men, and in the process find rootedness in your connection to the Jesse Tree.

11/29 - The Daughters of Zelophehad (Numbers 27:1-11)

Meet Mahlah, Noah, Hoglah, Milcah, and Tirzah, five determined sisters who stood up for their rights, petitioned Moses, and ensured their father's land would stay in their family for future generations.

11/30 - Ruth and Naomi (Ruth 1-4)

Long before she was David's great grandmother, and the grandmother of Jesse (who got this Advent tree started!), Ruth was a faithful daughter-in-law, whose creativity, love, and hard work ensured security for her family in Bethlehem.

12/1 – Hannah, Elkenah, and Samuel (1 Samuel 1-3)

Hannah and her husband Elkenah longed for a child. When their son Samuel was born, Hannah dedicated him to the Temple, and he would later become an important leader in Israel, thanks in no small part to the love and faithfulness of his mother.

12/2 – The Friendship of David and Jonathan (1 Samuel 18-20)

Long before David became king, he befriended Jonathan, son of King Saul. Ignoring the consequences of royal politics and family strife, Jonathan remained a true friend to David, ensuring his safety.

12/3 - Nathan: Advocate for Justice (2 Samuel 11:1-12:15)

Nathan had the courage to speak truth to power, something that's rare these days.

12/4 – Lydia: The Woman of Purple (Acts 16:13-15)

Considered the first convert to Christianity in Europe, Lydia was a wealthy woman, and dealer of purple dye, who offered hospitality to Paul.

12/5 - Zerubbabel Rebuilds the Temple (Ezra 4-6)

Zerubbabel and others returned from exile in Babylon to rebuild the Jerusalem temple.

12/6 - Nehemiah Shares Old Stories (Nehemiah 8)

When the Temple was finally rebuilt, Nehemiah and Ezra read the ancient scrolls and the people celebrated!

12/7 - Agur Prays for Enough (Proverbs 30:7-9)

Blink and you might miss it. In a simple proverb, Agur prays for enough.

12/8 - Mary and Elizabeth Gather in Joy (Luke 1:39-45)

Mary and Elizabeth, the mothers of Jesus and John, gather in expectant hope of motherhood, and find joy in one another's company.

12/9 - Ezekiel and the Dry Bones (Ekekiel 37:1-14)

Ezekiel, with God's help, brings life back into the valley of the dry bones.

12/10 - The Three Young Men (Daniel 3)

Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego live out their faith in a foreign land.

12/11 - Daniel and the Lion's Den (Daniel 6)

Daniel remains faithful even in the face of capital punishment.

12/12 - Mary's Song of Praise (Luke 1:46-55)

Mary accepts her calling, and thanks God for God's mighty works.

12/13 - Good Neighbors (Luke 10:25-37)

A Samaritan reminds us what it means to be a good neighbor.

12/14 - Moses and the Burning Bush (Exodus 2:23-3:22)

Moses stands on holy ground.

12/15 - The Strong Women of Exodus (Exodus 1:1-2:10)

A smart sister, a faithful mother, and cunning midwives are catalysts for liberation.

12/16 - Isaiah Speaks of Comfort (Isaiah 40)

Isaiah brings hope when hope seems an unlikely promise.

12/17 - Faithful Neighbors and Friends (Mark 2:1-12)

A neighbor is healed because of his four faithful and resourceful friends.

12/18 - Zacchaeus Responds (Luke 19:1-10)

Jesus identifies the right man for sharing good news.

12/19 - The Widow's Might (Mark 12:41-44)

A faithful woman demonstrates the true measure of generosity.

12/20 - Walking, Leaping and Praising! (Acts 3:1-10)

The intersection of faith and joy.

12/21 - Spirited Stephen (Acts 6:7)

The first deacon of our faith, and the first martyr, too.

12/22 - Dorcas: Faithful Servant (Acts 9:32-43)

Also called Tabitha, Dorcas was revered by an entire village.

12/23 - Aquila and Priscilla (Acts 18:1-3; 18-29)

Faithful co-workers for Paul and champions of the church at Ephesus.

12/24 - Queen Esther (Esther 1-9)

A good queen saves her people in a story with lots of drama.
