I LIFT UP MINE EYES...

Santa Maria del Mar is a famous church in Barcelona. Perhaps its most distinctive feature is that it was built in the 14th Century by the labor and resources of common men and women. Netflix is currently streaming a mini-



series entitled Cathedral of the Sea, based on a novel of the same name, that tells the story of the cathedral's construction.

One of the most intriguing parts of the show are the scenes that feature dockworkers, fishermen, and stone masons lugging boulders on their backs. They would carry these heavy stones more than a mile from the seashore to the construction site. Over the course of many decades their humble offerings literally built the foundation of a sacred place.

That church must be composed of a hundred-thousand stones. Each weighing a hundred or more pounds. And each traveling at least a mile, not to mention being hoisted high in the air. It's quite possible that those who carried stones every day for thirty years may never have seen the completion of their efforts. And yet each stone, each walk, each offering mattered inherently.

What kind of stones are we carrying?
What piece of ourselves are we giving regularly to build something bigger than ourselves?
Do we have any cathedrals built of I love you statements?
Do we have any cathedrals built of voicemails to lawmakers?
Do we have any cathedrals built of pocket change?
Do we have any cathedrals built of principled conversations?
Do we have any cathedrals built of heartfelt thoughts and prayers?
(I know there's a rush on social media to say those don't matter, but I think there's also a significant gap in understanding what prayer really is – if it's empty, and without action, it's not prayer.)

I believe that acts of love, repeated with consistency, generate impact, and ultimately change our world.

This past month has been a hard one – it feels as if we need seismic change to protect our world from all those selfish-isms that keep emerging. I hope that one day, we will have systems that can respond more quickly to the world's great needs.

But I do know that even the most stubborn and powerful systems are no match for consistent love. Love persists like the steady drip, drip, drip of water that carved out the earth's vast canyons. To carry our stones with consistency is to increase the pressure of love's flow. Love changes hearts. Love changes minds. Love changes the world. And more times than not, love takes as much work as lugging a boulder from the sea.

But the work of love lasts. May God call us to such work, and may the healing of that work be felt now and forever more.


MUSIC NOTES FROM HILARY
