Matthew defy Herod. After following
the star to Bethlehem, they meet the
baby Jesus, and take a less direct
route home. Their epiphany -- the
authentic power of God over the
artificial power of Caesar -- inspires us
to seek out justice in our world. And
who doesn't love friends bearing

DO YOU KNOW ABOUT THE GNOSTIC GOSPELS?

The Nag Hammadi Library is a collection of ancient manuscripts that was re-discovered in Egypt in 1945. The collection includes 52 early Christian and Gnostic texts, the most famous of which are the Gospel of Thomas, the Gospel of Mary, and the Gospel of Philip. Second Century Church leaders condemned these texts as heresy, but they offer significant insight into the diverse theological strands of early Jesus-followers. TROUBLESOME STORIES

Remember that what we read about the life of Jesus was written by people seeking to make sense of his ministry many decades after he actually lived.

Pharisees and Sadducees are villainized and misrepresented in these texts because of their theological disagreements with Jewish Christians

THEMES (SOME, NOT ALL!)

Jesus as the revelation/expression of God's presence and solidarity with humanity; faithful discipleship in a volatile world; love of God and neighbor as fulfilment of Torah; God is love; human agency and equality
