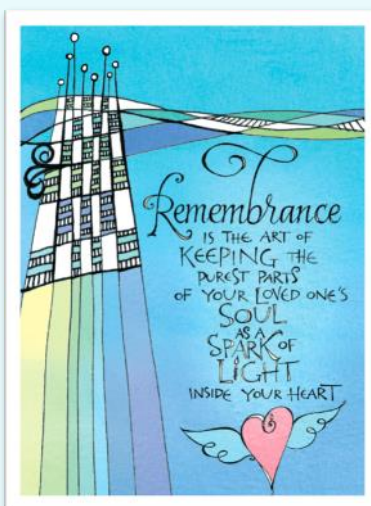

CELEBRATING ALL SAINTS

Who are the saints in your life? Not saints you've learned about in religious history lessons, but those who have revealed God's love to you in sundry ways—the ordinary folks whose lives have touched yours and had profound impacts on the person you are today? **All Saints Day** is a time to remember them and give thanks for the ways they have nourished, challenged, and helped you grow in faith.



The **Communion of Saints** describes those who have gone before us and now rest with God, together with the living who continue to walk with God. All Saints is also a time to consider our own place in this communion. How will people remember you and give thanks for your sainthood? How have you nourished the faith of those in your life? We have two special events planned during the week of All Saints to provide opportunities to remember and contemplate:

Wednesday, November 2nd — We will be joined by Ed Gash, labyrinth facilitator, for an All Souls Walk in the Sardis Baptist Prayer Garden. We'll gather in the meetinghouse for dinner at 5:45 PM, then proceed to the labyrinth for a guided walk and meditation.

Sunday, November 6th — Our worship service will be one of joy and grief as we remember loved ones who have died during the last year, along with the Great Cloud of Sardis Baptist witnesses who are the foundation for our worship community. This is a Sunday of power; as we speak the names of our saints, we hasten their spirits and are reminded that God's spirit resides in us too! May this embolden us to be living saints: people who share their gifts so that others might also know God's fullest presence and widest mercies.



MOVING BEYOND MYTH: A JUSTICE-CENTERED THANKSGIVING SERVICE

Tuesday, November 22nd

Save the Date for MeckMin's annual community-wide interfaith Thanksgiving service which will be hosted this year by the Rev. Dr. Dwayne Walker and the congregation of Little Rock AME Zion Church.

Sardis folks will gather at the meetinghouse at 5:45 PM to share a meal together before we caravan to the service in uptown Charlotte. Little Rock AME Zion is located at 401 N. McDowell Street. The service begins at 6:45 PM and ends at PM.

The 2022 Community-Wide Interfaith Thanksgiving Service will include Indigenous Carolina Catawba, Lumbee, and Tuscarora artists and activists in crafting a service that incorporates their traditional and current practices to address the myth-making around the traditional Thanksgiving story, offer a truer and more complete story, and suggest actions toward justice that attendees and MeckMin can take. While deeply rooted in Indigenous history and traditions, the service will be accessible to people of all faiths.



I LIFT UP MINE EYES...

A lost sheep nuzzles into the grass-stained shoulder of a shepherd who's gone searching for her. An old woman throws a party to celebrate finding the coin that went missing. A daddy streaks across a field to welcome home a son returned from wanderlust.

There is joy! There is gratitude! There is reconciliation! In these simple stories, Jesus paints a picture of God's extravagant love. The most significant being in existence loves us, pursues us, welcomes us, and parents us. Thanks be to God!

Still, we struggle to make sense of all this magnanimity.

The cynic wonders why a shepherd would waste all that time on just one and not ninety-nine. The banker questions the fiscal responsibility of splurging on a party. The jealous older brother asks, "Don't you see me, too?"

The systems of this world try to tell us that our gratitude must be tempered by efficiency and logic, or even discarded by our jealousy and self-interest. And besides, it's too much effort to cook a turkey!

Please know that thanksgiving is NOT an idle pursuit. Please also know that it's a verb! When we are intentional about noticing AND expressing our gratitude, we are much more likely to receive the subtle and not-so-subtle gifts around us. We are much more likely to share and receive the love of God around us. We are much more likely to be aware of the sources that sustain us. We are much more open to transformative change.

What dad wouldn't trade a thousand fortunes for the chance to tell his little boy, "You're found!" What beauty there is in a connection where voice and touch still the stormy seas! What shepherd would be so foolish as to dismiss the value of that love? What neighbor could not see the timeless value of joy and fellowship shared with an entire neighborhood?

When we notice the lost sheep, the lost coin, and the lost son, we reconnect to what grounds us. There can be power in that gratitude!

It is election season. What might it mean to vote with gratitude? How might your generosity give new possibilities to your neighbors? How might your demand for efficiency and self-perseverance eliminate them? Is the world big enough for your neighbor's joy and wellbeing, too?

It's a season of remembrance. Another year of saints to name. There is grief. As we mourn what has been lost, can we also carve out space for what might still be? Can our lives be an expression of gratitude for those whose gratitude has shaped us?

It's budget season. We are grateful, but are we also faithful? Will the generous gifts we receive become vessels of shared generosity? Or will they simply keep us safe and secure?

The kingdom of heaven is like a congregation who practiced thanksgiving. May it be so!

Phillip is carrying on the history of the two families as he reshapes and fits right into the one family created when Amanda and Bennett were married on December 24, 2017. They have moved from a congruity of two to a congruity of three. Phillip joined them on August 19, 2022 at 4:12pm, weighing in at eight pounds and stretching to twenty-one inches long.

At two and a half months, Phillip sports a head of red hair, already has real smiles and loves to play, batting with his hands at those tempting objects over his head. His father describes him as voracious. Another way he fits in, for Bennett is a creative foodie and likes to experiment with food preparation. At present his interest has turned to baked bread, bagels and pretzels. And Amanda spent an interesting summer as an intern with Historic Foodways in colonial Williamsburg, recreating the food of the eighteenth century.

Phillip goes along for the ride when his parents enjoy hiking over scenic trails. And even though he may sleep through some of them, he is present when Bennett and Amanda turn on their favorite comedies and classic sit coms.

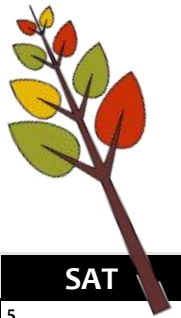

Who Do We Say We Are? Eight Areas of Focus

During our October Sardis Academy sessions we gave thought to who we are, what we want to be, and how we live out our calling. Upon review of our church covenant and promises, Pastor Bob honed in on eight areas of focus for our congregation:

1. **HOSPITALITY**—We seek to be a people of welcome. We genuinely desire for guests to be themselves.
2. **WORSHIP**—We make an intentional, consistent, and corporate effort to praise our Creator.
3. **COMMUNITY OUTREACH**—We seek to be part of the neighborhood; we want to connect with Charlotte and the larger world.
4. **PROPHETIC WITNESS**—Our covenant says that we desire to share the good news of God's love and salvation with the world. That means we want to share (both privately and publicly) something about how we see God in the world. We want our words, actions, and relationships to reflect God's transcendent and transformative presence among us.
5. **SERVICE & MISSIONS**—These are some of the tangible (traditionally missional) things we do to be good neighbors to both local and global communities.
6. **SPIRITUAL GIFT GIVING**—Everyone one of us (every single one!) has something unique and special to offer the world. We want to create an environment where people feel safe, empowered, and emboldened to both be *and* express themselves authentically, and to live into the story alongside of us.
7. **SPIRITUAL FORMATION**—We want to be intentional about offering ways to grow and inform our faith; we also want to be intentional about creating the kind of spaces where we respect (even celebrate!) the uniqueness of every person's spiritual journey.
8. **RELATIONSHIPS & CONNECTION**—We want to be human! We want to create meaningful friendships and relationships of mutuality, care, and trust.
