Working to solve family homelessness

During the season of Advent, we offer Sardis friends the opportunity to honor or memorialize special people in our lives. Historically, we've displayed poinsettias in our sanctuary on Christmas Eve as a visual reminder of the love and appreciation we feel. During worship, the names of honorees are read aloud. In recent years, we've put worship in action by honoring our loved ones a bit differently - by donating to causes in support of those less fortunate than ourselves. The recipient for this year's donations will be clients of Charlotte Family Housing.

Charlotte Family Housing (CFH) is a shelter-to-housing program for working families experiencing homelessness. Clients begin their journey to self-sufficiency in the Shelter Phase where they are empowered to manage a household budget, establish healthy routines, and become more involved in their children's education. Families also begin to work with social workers, who provide wraparound supportive services. They address barriers to family stability and facilitate pathways to financial literacy, education, health and wellness, and job readiness.

After completing the Shelter Phase, families transition into the Housing Phase. Housing resource coordinators connect families with housing through a network of housing providers across Mecklenburg County. CFH provides rental subsidies that span the gap between the families' earning capacity and the market rental rate until they can sustain housing on their own. CFH provides a full year of social work services during the Housing Phase, with the potential for renewal if the family continues to meet eligibility requirements.

Donations received by Sardis Baptist in lieu of poinsettias will be used to support a seasonal CFH program that aids families in transition: Home for the Holidays. Household starter kits are given to single-parent families to help them launch successfully as they move from the shelter to homes of their own. The kits provide basic provisions such as air mattresses, sheets, pillows, towels, pots and pans, dishes and silverware, toiletries, and canned goods. The cost of a Home for the Holidays Kit ranges from \$400—\$600, depending on the number of children.

If you'd like to help Sardis build Home for the Holidays Kits, please consider honoring or memorializing a loved one this Christmas. Provide the following information to the church:

I LIFT UP MINE EYES... Rev. Bob Stillerman

I started preparing our Christmas decorations in early October. Don't roll your eyes at me! I'm not trying to be disrespectful of the liturgical calendar, and like most people, I also wish the retailers would wait until Thanksgiving to string their lights. (One exception: peppermint should be evergreen!) But I have a hunch you started your



preparations in October, too. I'm talking about raking leaves.

Good luck stringing those icicle lights with a gutter full of wet muck, or securing those inflatables in six inches of leaves, or dragging Santa's sleigh over all those acorns and pinecones. And raise your hand if those pesky leaves tend to interfere with other important weekend errands.

Of course, it's not all bad. One morning of raking leaves makes my Fitbit very happy. And the natural areas and critters are grateful for another layer of nutrients or house-building materials. And a leaf pile to play in is a whole lot easier to clean up than a den full of Legos or stray puzzle pieces.

Most importantly, it's kind of a spiritual activity (not so spiritual that I want to do it every week of the year, but still spiritual). Advent is our readying, and indeed our acknowledgment of God's presence in the world. We wait with expectant hope for the Christchild, and for the newness God will bring in the coming year. We also give thought to what will be birthed anew in our own lives, and what we might offer to make God's presence more known and felt in our communities.

Each fall, the leaves change colors, and eventually land in my lawn. The plants, blooms, and greenery of the summer season fade as well. But I am not sad, because I know they'll be back in the coming season, displaying both a familiarity and a newness that captures my imagination.

In their own way, the leaves are also a calendar or scrapbook of the previous year. As I blow them away, new, green grass is revealed. I also see the rock garden made of my daughters' initials that comes back into focus. There's the strand of lights I hung below our deck and forgot about last season. The swing set gets a wash, and the firepit is safe for gatherings again. An old fencepost, and a few stones will be reclaimed to repair a foot path. Bird feeders are replenished, and there's clean, clear water in the bird bath. And new mulch to keep our winter bulbs cozy. And Christmas flamingos, because that's just how we roll.

My arms are tired. And those oak leaves are skinny, and stubborn, and like Velcro. And there are times where I just want to stop, and be done with all this readying. But I want something new. I want something meaningful. Each swing of the rake makes room for a new memory – perhaps a grass stain on an Easter dress from the daredevil roll down the hill, or the squeal of delight at seeing the first yellow daffodil.

God's newness is coming, y'all! In the days and weeks ahead, how will you make space for that newness?

ADVENT


A bow is indicative of unity – two or more


