

IRENA HRAMENKOVA ~ 30 YEARS OF SERVICE ~

A tribute by Hilary McIntyre, Minister of Music

January 18, 2023 marked the 30th Anniversary of Irena Hramenkova joining the Sardis Baptist Church staff. When Irena joined in 1993, the Sardis congregation was meeting in the cafeteria of Providence Day School and our current church building and grounds were just a twinkle in the eye of the then members. Although most of those founding members have moved on, the heart and soul of Sardis remain, in large part thanks to Irena.



In December of 1991, Irena was in Washington, D.C., visiting a friend in Washington – this was three days before the collapse of the Soviet Union. A year earlier, in 1990, Irena had lost her husband and two years before that, in 1988, she lost her father. With all of this upheaval in mind, she called her mother in Moscow and asked for her advice - should she stay in the United States? Could she afford to? Her mother was encouraging so she started making plans.

Later, a friend brought Irena to Charlotte, where she met Anne Farin, a local pianist and educator who was a member of the Charlotte Piano Teachers Forum. On January 5, 1993, Irena, who still did not speak much English, visited the Forum and asked Anne and the other members to help her find work in the Charlotte-area – they all put their heads together and learned through the grapevine that a woman named Bestelle Hill, a member of a new church named Sardis, needed help. Their pianist had just left the previous Sunday and they needed someone to fill in the following week. Irena met with Bestelle, who asked her to play a few hymns as a sort of audition, and she was asked to accompany the service that week. After that first worship experience, the members of Sardis agreed that Irena fit the bill and she was asked to stay. Douglas Aldrich, the pastor of Sardis Baptist Church at that time, and Bestelle Hill would sponsor Irena in getting her work visa. From here, in 1996, Irena joined the Southern Park Music School as a piano teacher.

Irena's work visa was set to expire in 2000, so she began the process of becoming a United States citizen. It can be hard to gain citizenship as someone who only works part-time, but Irena was able to use her connections in the gymnastics world to petition the government and she quickly received her green card as a person of "Extraordinary Ability" - don't

Through the years, Irena has played for us, worshipped with us, she founded her own private lesson studio – the Sardis Piano Academy – in 2008, and all the while she has stuck with us here at Sardis. She is a world-class pianist, an exceptional teacher, an indispensable partner in worship, but most of all, she is family. We love her.

Thank you for 30 years Irena, here's to as many more as possible!

A SEASON OF DISCOVERY

At the conclusion of the discovery process (we hope late spring or early summer), the Sardis Discovery Team will present its findings to the congregation. And then, together, we as Sardis will determine our next steps.

We are grateful to Ellen Dillard, Rachel Faulk, Luther Fisher, Jean Lawrence, Jim Owen, Shannon Roberts, and Amy Wiebke for their willingness to serve Sardis in this meaningful way. We ask you to pray for the success of their work, and ultimately, for the transformative things their work will provoke at Sardis in the years to come.

OVERVIEW— There are a number of misconceptions about the Bible. Many look at it as information only, but what they are missing is the key – the Bible is about transformation. Friar Richard Rohr invites you to revisit the Bible to experience the Scripture as spirituality. This can help your relationship with God evolve into something more meaningful and fulfilling. This book will help you discover how reading the Bible and understanding it in a new way can change your life.

"Only when the two come together, inner and outer authority, do we have true spiritual wisdom. We have for too long insisted on outer authority alone, without any teachings of prayer, inner journey and maturing consciousness. The results for the world and for religion have been disastrous...I offer these reflections to again unite what never should have been separated: Sacred Scripture and Christian Spirituality." – from the introduction.

This spiritual companion unearths the Bible's take on morality, power, wisdom, and the generosity of God in a way that demands a



life-changing response from believers. It illustrates the Biblical God as full of grace and abundance, and who calls us to be fully alive in a world full of scarcity, judgement, and fear. Rohr's intention is to revitalize your relationship with the Bible and leave you feeling hopeful, fulfilled, and better able to embody a Christ-based spirituality. This in turn will help you to change how you treat yourself, others, and the world.

A CREATIVE EXERCISE FOR TRANSFIGURATION

"God became human, so that humans could become God."
~ Iraneus, 3rd Century ~

Transfiguration Sunday is February 19th. This is the day we remember the mountaintop story of Jesus's transfiguration before Peter, James, and John. This story teaches us something important about the character of God: if you want to know what divinity looks like in human form, look at Jesus and you will see God. And if we want to know who and what Jesus is, we too must prepare to be transfigured.

- Write a short list of words or phrases that describe the core of your character.
- 2. Ask people in your inner circle to tell you three words or phrases that describe your character. Record their answers.
- 3. What are commonalities between the lists?
- 4. Create something using those key characteristics —a drawing, a painting, word art, music, a story. The possibilities are endless!
- 5. Share it with loved ones in your circle. If your creation is visual, post it somewhere you'll see everyday as a reminder. Use your creation as inspiration for the challenge below.
- Challenge yourself to transfiguration to embody the characteristics you most wish to exemplify.
- 7. Manifest your transfiguration by committing to an action (or a few) to take during Lent.
