WALK AS ONE FOR PEACE

May 6th @ 1:00 PM in the Sardis Prayer Garden



Saturday, May 6th is World Labyrinth Day and thousands of people will participate in the fifteenth annual recognition. Participants worldwide will "Walk as One at 1" by walking a labyrinth at 1:00 PM their local time to create a rolling wave of peaceful energy passing from one time zone to the next around the globe.

We invite you to join Sardis friend and certified labyrinth facilitator, Ed Gash, at the Sardis Baptist Church prayer garden for a guided labyrinth meditation on this special day. The walk will begin at 1:00 PM. Those who are unable to attend in person are encouraged to download a finger labyrinth and participate virtually. Various finger labyrinth styles are available for download on the World Labyrinth Day website (<https://www.worldlabyrinthday.org/resources/finger-labyrinths>).

Labyrinths have been used for spiritual purposes as far back as 5,000 years. Archeological digs have found them among ancient Cretans, Etruscans, Normans, Hindus and Native Americans. One labyrinth pattern found on a figurine in the Ukraine was dated to 15,000 B.C.

Labyrinths became popular among Christians during the Middle Ages, though the oldest existing labyrinth was placed in the Church of Reparatus in Algeria in the 4th century. Walking a labyrinth became an alternative prayer pilgrimage when the Crusades made visits to the Holy Land too dangerous.

Unlike mazes, in which there are multiple pathways and unforeseen dead ends, a labyrinth has a single path leading to the center. You cannot get lost in a labyrinth. It always leads you home.

This is a great metaphor for a life of faith. Somehow, despite all the twists and turns of life, God is always there to be found, waiting to embrace us in times of joy, or sorrow, or sheer bewilderment, and ready to guide us forward.

Our Creation Window in the meetinghouse centers us in praise and worship. Did you know that our Communion Plate and Chrismon Ornaments, both pottery creations of Janette Grassi, are depictions of the window?

We chime the trinity on Sunday mornings. Did you know that the bell we use was given to us by Bestelle Hill, our first minister of music? And did you know that the sink in our kitchen was originally used in her husband Don's pharmacy lunch counter? And better still, did you know that Don and Bestelle established a music endowment that provides funding for guest musicians and other music-driven initiatives?

There are honorarium stones in our labyrinth and prayer garden. In 2018, we honored five community partners for their efforts in creating a better Charlotte: Crisis Assistance, Loaves and Fishes, Baptist Retirement Homes of NC, Urban Ministries (now Roof Above), and Habitat for Humanity.

DESIGNATED MISSIONS

Each year during Lent we collect donations for a cause that emulates the work of Jesus in today's world. This year's benefactor was **QC Family Tree**, an organization that has been working for justice in West Charlotte since 2005. They endeavor to build power in Black communities while disrupting and dismantling white supremacy.

Thanks to many Sardis friends who contributed, we were able to send more than \$1,200 to support the life-changing programs of QCFT.

Sardis Baptist Church has made a meaningful difference in the lives of students from Charlotte Secondary School through our Goodness Groceries collection. Your financial donations are used to purchase supplies for the school's food pantry as well as breakfast and lunch programs for students who do not have food available at home. Approximately 60% of CSS students qualify for free and reduced lunch, so the needs are significant. Sardis Baptist was able to make a large delivery at the end of April thanks to the financial support of Sardis friends who have been contributing to this effort since the food pantry was initially opened in Spring of 2020.

PENTECOST

Sunday, May 28th is Pentecost. According to Acts, this is day that followers of Jesus' way, gathered together in Jerusalem, were filled with the Holy Spirit. They heard sounds of rushing winds, saw flames of fire, and began to speak in unfamiliar languages. Others in Jerusalem, of diverse backgrounds, heard the noise and came to see. They were amazed that these Galileans were speaking in their native tongues. Many were baptized into the movement that day. They devoted themselves to the teachings and fellowship of the apostles and the spread the message. This was the beginning of what we now call Christianity. Prior to Pentecost, there were followers of Jesus, but no organized movement.

Think of the symbolism of the language of this story. The rushing wind is invisible, yet powerful, like the Holy Spirit. Fire has the ability to illuminate and incinerate. We follow spiritual pathways in hopes of enlightenment, as well as to deliver us from the evils we've encountered along the way. The multilingual miracle of Pentecost represents our calling to be in community with all people—those who look, speak, and believe like us and those who don't. It challenges us to examine our biases against those who do not share our language, system of beliefs, and culture.

***"There is no longer Jew or Greek, there is no longer slave or free,
there is no longer male and female; for all of you are one in Christ Jesus," (Galatians 3:28).***
