On Sunday, July 16th, twenty Sardis congregants traveled to the Elizabeth neighborhood to worship with friends at Caldwell Presbyterian Church. The "field trip" evolved out of feedback from the Design and Discovery team's work this spring. There was a deep desire to learn how other faith communities



are worshiping and expressing their shared vision of God's Spirit moving among them. And what better way to do that than seeing for ourselves?

In the coming weeks, we hope to make space to share our impressions of the experience. What might we glean from our time in a new space, and are there any new practices, phrases, feelings, or actions that could influence and embolden our own worship style?

I want to share three initial impressions, as well as the follow-up correspondence I've had with Rev. John Cleghorn.

- It was helpful to be a guest in a new place. It's got me imagining what it might be like to worship at Sardis for the first time.
- It was really fun to be the recipient of another congregation's joy.
 For a small window of time, they offered us a spiritual gift: their sincere presence.
- It was beautiful to see a baptism. No, their congregation is not a
 replica of ours. But how wonderful to know that other communities are committing to the care of their own villages, with the
 same sense of purpose and intentionality we seek to commit to
 our own. We are connected!
